Small Catechism of the Week (try to commit to memory): What is the Introduction of the Lord's Prayer? Our Father who art in heaven.

What does this mean?

With these words God tenderly invites us to believe that He is our true Father and that we are His true children, so that with all boldness and confidence we may ask Him as dear children ask their dear father.

What is the First Petition?

Hallowed be Thy name.

What does this mean?
